Kenny, who is getting pressure from Senior Management wanting us to confirm industry's continued efforts to advocate for vaccinations and continue with the modified attestations. • The City wants us to demonstrate impact on City projects if the requirement is that all workers be vaccinated. • Based on the H & S committee discussions, our industry has reached an average of 90% vaccination. • The Greater Ottawa Truckers Association has confirmed that approximately 50% of the truckers are vaccinated. • City staff vaccination deadline is February 1, 2022. • In Quebec, the new definition of vaccinated means the 3 doses. • Sudbury recently announced the vaccination requirement applies to those in an inside setting only and that 2 vaccinations are required. <p>(b) No Liaison Notes as the December Liaison meeting was cancelled.</p> <p>(c) The January 7, 2022 forecast tender list was circulated by email.</p> <p>(d) Agenda items for January 21, 2022 Liaison meeting – send items to K.
